Donna's Winter Frost Infinity Crochet Scarf



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You can use the pattern to create any item you want and sell your finished item if you wish, but you have no right to claim that this pattern is created by you, nor may you sell the pattern or share the written pattern. You have no right to create a video tutorial for this pattern without my written permission.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Even if the pattern looks detailed it is surprisingly easy and fast to work on. The pattern is just 2 rows to set the pattern and then just repeating row 2 until the scarf is the length you want and then a final row to finish ready for joining.

By changing the colours, you can totally change the mood of your project.

Please read through the pattern before starting your scarf.

EXPERIENCE LEVEL: Confident Beginner **LANGUAGE & TERMINOLOGY:** English, UK

TECHNIQUE: Crochet using chains, double crochet, treble crochet and slip stitches.

PATTERN REPEAT: Multiple of 4 stitches

STITCHES & ABBREVIATIONS:

ch/chs (chain/chains)
st/sts (stitch/stitches)
R/Rs (row/rows)
tr/trs (treble crochet)
dc/dcs (double crochet)
sl st/sl sts (slip stitch/slip stitches)
sk (skip)

COLOURS

For this scarf you will need 3 x 100g balls of a double knitting yarn

YARN, HOOK & APPROXIMATE SIZE

HOOK SIZE: 4.5mm

TIP

If you find you are tight crocheter you can always move up to a 5mm hook and if you are a loose crocheter you can move down to a 4mm hook.

Wide Eye Darning Needle

YARN: Stylecraft Cabaret DK Ocean 3571

PATTERN

Work a foundation chain of 56 stitches

TIP: Make the chain stitches quite loose so that it will be easy to work into them for Row 1. You can also go up a size in crochet hook to 5mm just for the chain row and revert back to the 4.5mm hook to complete the scarf.

Row 1: Tr in 4th ch from hook; *sk next 3 chs, work (dc, ch 3, 3 trs) all in next ch; rep from *to last 4 chs, sk 3 chs, dc in last ch; ch 3, turn.

Row 2: Tr is first dc; *sk next 3 trs, work (dc, ch 3, 3 trs) all in next ch-3 space; repeat from * across, dc in turning ch space; ch 3, turn.

Repeat Row 2 for pattern until you reach the desired length. I completed 70 rows for this pattern but it can be made shorter or longer.

Final Row: Tr in first dc; *sk next 3 trs, work a dc in ch-3 space, ch 1, tr in dc; repeat from * across to last 3 trs, dc in ch-3 space, ch 1, tr in dc, tr in turning ch space.

At this point you can fasten off and stitch together the ends of your scarf using a wide eye darning needle or you can slip stitch the two ends together and then fasten off.

Voila - your scarf is complete!

Joining a self striping yarn

TIP

If you are using a self striping yarn like the Stylecraft Cabaret Double Knitting yarn, give some consideration where you choose to end your scarf ready for joining it together. Try and match up the stripe colours so that your join is less visible.

In the photograph above, the join is barely visible in the centre and the colours stripe in a relatively uniform manner.
